



New FM frequency for WRS World Radio Switzerland throughout Greater Geneva

During the night of 8 - 9 December, the FM frequency that relays WRS World Radio Switzerland to Greater Geneva from the Salève transmitter will change from 88.4 MHz to 101.7 MHz.

The Federal Office of Communications, OFCOM, has been forced to reorganise frequencies in the Greater Geneva area to accommodate the new broadcast licences that have been issued to private radio stations.

This means that SRG SSR must release the 88.4 MHz frequency (Salève transmitter) which has up to now relayed WRS World Radio Switzerland. During the night of 8-9 December, this radio station will therefore move to its newly allocated frequency of 101.7 MHz. If you are one of the listeners who receives WRS World Radio Switzerland terrestrially from the Salève transmitter, you will have to adjust your FM radio to the new frequency.

Most of WRS World Radio Switzerland's listeners in the Greater Geneva area receive the station via cable. WRS reception via cable, digital radio (DAB/DAB+), internet and satellite remains unchanged.
